Vehicle crashes are the #1 cause of death for people between the ages of 15 and 24. In this highly interactive class, young drivers will learn skills and defensive driving techniques that will keep them safer on the road. Participants will learn how to take control of situations by taking responsibility for their own driving behavior and how to reduce their risks.

This four and a half (4.5) hour course is offered monthly through Santa Rosa Junior College's Community Education Office. Pre-registration is required. Please bring (or fax) your court papers when you register.

SRJC's Community Education Office: The Community Education Office is located in Pioneer Hall near the front of SRJC's campus (enter off of Mendocino Avenue, turning on Burbank Circle Drive). The course fee is \$85. Payment can be made by cash, check, VISA, Discover Card, or MasterCard.

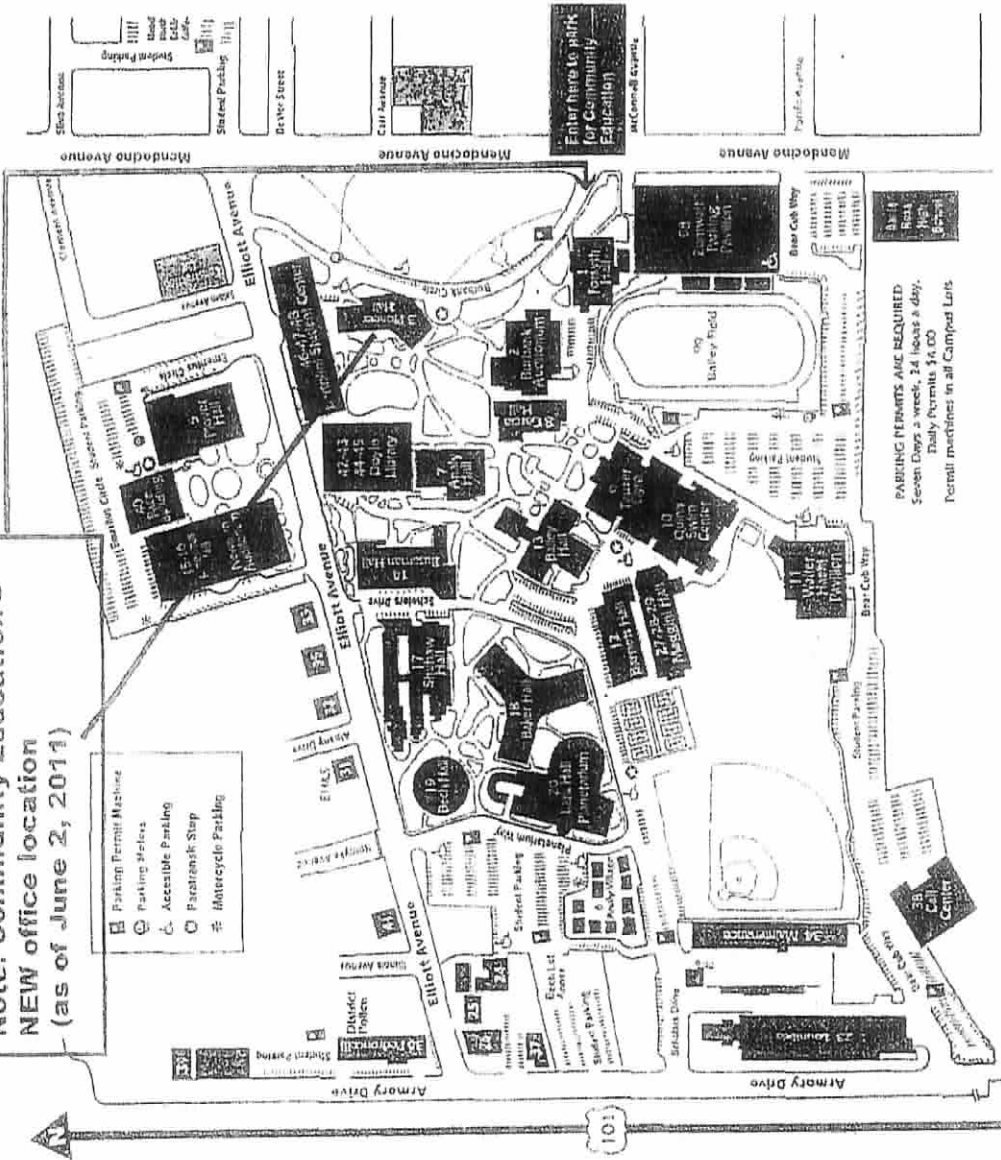
